Homeshare initiatives in disability in the ACT, WA and Victoria will be presented. This is a challenging but exciting time in the disability service landscape in the new world of the Australian National Disability Insurance Scheme. The potential for Homeshare and other shared living programs to play an important role is enormous. Community Connections in the ACT will lead the workshop examining both Homeshare and shared living with valuable input from the highly successful UK organisation Shared Lives Plus and WA's Perth Home Care Services.



Homeshare – housing in exchange for help

Serving equally the interests of home providers and home seekers

The beauty (or some say the curse) of the exchange model of Homeshare is that it doesn't fit neatly into a service category because it is both a housing program and a support or care program. This is confusing for governments and funders.



It is said that the best homeshare organisation must have the interests of both seekers and providers <u>equally</u> in mind rather than focus on one client group such as seniors, families, people with disabilities, or the homeless, students, low income singles.

The workshop will debate this position and explore the implications of different approaches, in terms of service models, marketing and practice.



Community of Practice - CoP

Homeshare practitioners and those wanting to learn about HS practice should bring practice questions, issues and case studies to the workshop.

Time permitting, the workshop will look at methodology and variations of Homeshare models – with a focus on the future and expanding Homeshare beyond the traditional service system to a market based system.
